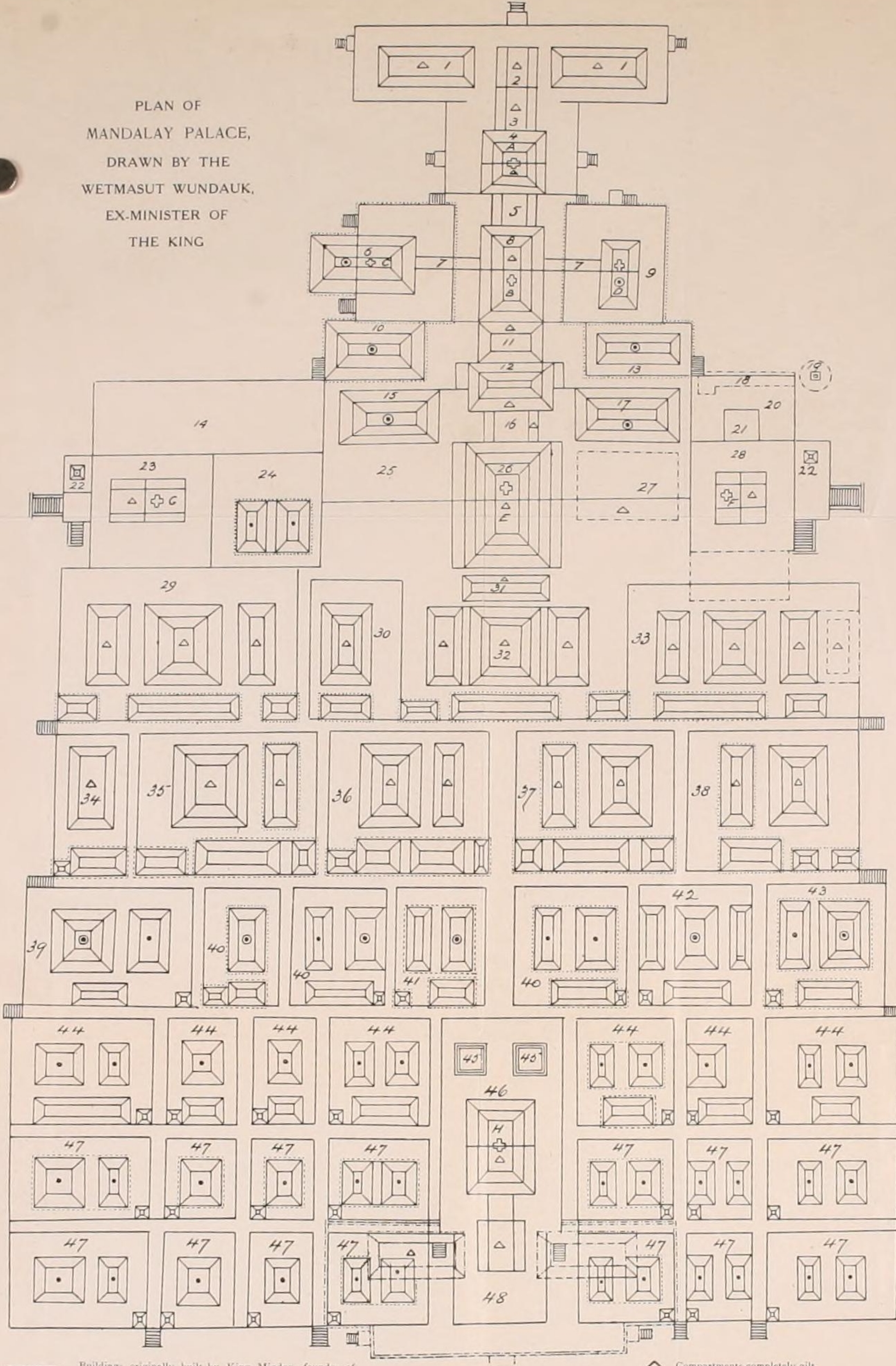


PLAN OF

A.	Shwé-nan-pyat-that-taw-gyi.	Thiha-tha-na.	Lion.	Ya-ma-né (Clogwood).	Here the King and the Chief Queens received Kadaws (homage) three times a year. These three Kadaw days were the Hnit-thit Kadaw at the beginning of the Burmese year in the month of Nayon, the Wawin Kadaw at the beginning of Lent in Wazo, and the Wagyt Kadaw at the end of Lent in Thadingyut.
B.	Ze-ta-wun-zaung-daw.	Han-tha-tha-na.	Duck.	Thin-gan tha (<i>Hopex odorata</i>).	In this were kept the images of the Royal ancestors. It was also used for the reception of foreigners.
C.	Byé-daik-zaung-daw.	Gaza-tha-na.	Elephant.	Sa-ga-tha (Champac).	This was occupied by Atwinwuns, the Ministers of the Interior. The King also sat here when there was occasion for the appointment of the Eingshemín, or Crown Prince.
D.	Le-tha-zaung-daw.	Thin-ka-tha-na.	Shellfish.	Pein-né-tha (Jack Fruit).	The King came here occasionally and received his pages (sons of Ministers), called Lapet-yi-daw.
E.	Mhan-nan-zaung-daw-gyi.	Ba-ma-ya-tha-na.	Bee.	Karawé (Martaban Camphor-wood).	This was used when there was any one to be raised to the dignity of Chief Queen, and also when the ear-boring ceremony of the King's daughters took place.
F.	Taung-Samók-zaung-daw.	Mi-ga-tha-na.	Deer.	Ye-tha-phan (<i>Ficus glomerata</i>).	
G.	Myauk-Samók-zaung-daw.	Ma-ni-ya-tha-na.	Peacock.	Pauck-tha (Butea-tree).	When presents of elephants were brought to him, the King sat here to accept them.
H.	Anauk-pwé-det-ze-tawun-zaung-daw.	Pa-du-ma-tha-na.	Lily.	Tha-yet-tha (Mango-tree).	As in the Shwé-nan-pyat-that-taw-gyi (Great Audience Hall), the King and the Chief Queen received here members of the Royal family, Princes, Queens, and wives of Ministers of all ranks, who appeared before them to "beg pardon" at the end of Lent.
